This Addendum is hereby made a part of the Invitation for Bids (IFB) and Project Documents to the same extent as if it were originally included therein and is intended to modify and/or interpret the bidding documents by additions, deletions, clarifications, or corrections. The Contractor shall acknowledge receipt of this Addendum on the "Receipt of Addenda" form (herein attached) and shall include the form in their Proposal Submittal documents.

BIDDING DOCUMENT CHANGES

1. Appendix A - KCATA Standard Contract Terms and Conditions. Item 5.B.2 Warranty of Work and Maintenance. DELETE and REPLACE with the following:

The work must be of safe, substantial, and durable construction in all respects. The Contractor hereby guarantees the work against defective materials or faulty workmanship for a minimum period of one (2) years after final payment by KCATA and shall replace or repair any defective products, equipment or materials or faulty workmanship during the period of the guarantee at no cost to KCATA. As additional security for these guarantees, the Contractor shall, prior to the release of final payment, furnish separate maintenance (or guarantee) bonds in form acceptable to KCATA written by the same corporate surety that provides the performance bond for this Contract. These bonds shall secure the Contractor's obligation to replace or repair defective products, equipment and materials and faulty workmanship for a minimum period of Two (2) years after final payment and shall be written in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Sum, as adjusted (if at all).

2. Section 2 Technical Specifications/Scope of Work. Item J Vendor Qualifications No. 3. DELETE AND REPLACE with the following:

The contractor shall have a minimum of 5 years of experience in the supply and installation of vehicle paint booth equipment, including coordination of this equipment with fire protection systems to ensure compliance with NFPA 33.

3. DELETE ORIGINALLY PUBLISHED Attachment O, Missouri Division of Labor Standards – Annual Wage Order No. 33, and REPLACE with attached.

BIDDER QUESTIONS/REQUESTS FOR CLARIFICATION

1. Q: I wanted to see if you would be open to us providing a Weather-Rite bid alternate.

A: The model submitted is not approved. The makeup air unit schedule on sheet M-1 calls for a 15 HP motor, whereas the Weather-rite model submitted indicates it requires a 30 HP motor.

2. Q: Is there an associated control sequence? I am not seeing one on the plan set.

A: A control sequence was not specified. The control sequence for the makeup air unit must be coordinated with the new paint booth control panel.

OVERTIME and HOLIDAYS

OVERTIME

For all work performed on a Sunday or a holiday, not less than twice (2x) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work.

For all overtime work performed, not less than one and one-half (1½) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work or contractual obligation. For purposes of this subdivision, **"overtime work"** shall include work that exceeds ten hours in one day and work in excess of forty hours in one calendar week; and

A thirty-minute lunch period on each calendar day shall be allowed for each worker on a public works project, provided that such time shall not be considered as time worked.

HOLIDAYS

January first;
The last Monday in May;
July fourth;
The first Monday in September;
November eleventh;
The fourth Thursday in November; and
December twenty-fifth;

If any holiday falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be considered a holiday.
